1. This year's appropriation request includes a hospital project (\$9.9 million) that received authorization, and authorization of appropriation in the FY02 supplemental.
2. Explanation of Authorization, Authorization of Appropriation and Appropriation.
 - a. Authorizing legislation provides for the operation of a federal program or agency either indefinitely or for a specific period of time or that sanctions a particular type of obligation or expenditure within a program. Authorizing legislation is normally a prerequisite for appropriations.
 - b. The Authorization column reflects authorized amounts for major construction projects by installation, state and country for the active forces. This is also called line-item authorization of projects.
 - c. The Authorization of Appropriations column reflects the total funds authorized for appropriation for military construction activities. In addition to the line-item authorized projects, it includes activities that are not line-item authorized - such as planning and design, minor construction, family housing operation and maintenance, base realignment and closure, and guard and reserve construction.
 - d. The Appropriations column reflects the request for legal authority for federal agencies to incur obligations and to make payments out of Treasury for specified purposes. An Appropriation Act fulfills the requirement of Article I, section 9 of the Constitution, which provides that "no money shall be drawn from the Treasury, but in Consequence of Appropriations made by Law."
